MO: Male subject threatened to shoot a group of juveniles.

RSA 631:4 (B) Criminal Threatening (2 Counts)

On 8/1/11 at approx 0424hrs I (Ofc Brandreth) was dispatched to the area of Cartier St and Walsh Ave for a male with a gun call. Dispatch advised me and other responding units that the caller stated a male subject had just pulled a gun on one of her friends. The caller described it as a snub nose revolver. The caller told dispatch that the suspects were still outside in the area of Cartier St and Walsh Ave. The wagon (Ofc's C.P. Day and Feather) were the first unit to arrive and they said over the radio that the suspects had entered the building on the north west corner of Notre Dame Ave and Walsh Ave.

I spoke to the caller who identified herself as

[REDACTED] said that she was with some of her friends and they were standing in the street in front of 76 Walsh Ave having a conversation. She said they were there for about an hour just standing there talking to each other. [REDACTED] said that a male subject was on the second floor porch at 44 Notre Dame Ave. She said that he had been there for a while and he was drinking and then he walked down the stairs and came outside. [REDACTED] said that the male subject walked over to their group. She said she had never met the male subject before. [REDACTED] said that when the male approached them he was flipping out. She described him as a white male, around 40 years old, approx 5'8" tall and skinny. She said he had a combover hair style, he was wearing glasses, pants, and no shirt.

[REDACTED] said that the male subject started yelling at them. He said, "What the fuck is going on in my neighborhood?" [REDACTED] said the male subject was approaching her quickly and one of her friends named Nick Sullivan stepped between them. [REDACTED] said that the male subject said to NICK, "What the fuck are you looking at, do you wanna die tonight?" [REDACTED] said that the male subject took his left hand out of the pocket of his pants and had a small revolver in his left hand. [REDACTED] said that the male subject raised the revolver and pointed it directly at NICK. She said that she could not see the color of the gun, but could tell it was a small revolver with a short barrel. She said it was small and looked like a toy but she thought it was real. [REDACTED] said that NICK backed away from the male and the male then pointed the firearm at her. [REDACTED] said that the male subject put the firearm back into his pocket and she and all of her friends ran away and scattered to different friends houses in the area.

[REDACTED] said that the male subject's actions put her in fear of being harmed. She thought the revolver was real and was scared that she was going to be shot.

I asked [REDACTED] if she knew where NICK was now. She said she was not sure but thought that he did not want to be involved. [REDACTED] said she did not know NICK's birthday and thought he was around 16 or 17 years old. She knew he was from Raymond NH but did not know his address.

Shortly after I spoke to [REDACTED] a male subject walked out and identified himself as

Nicholas Sullivan

[REDACTED]

NICHOLAS said that he was staying with a friend in Manchester for the night at an unknown address on the west side. He said that they were walking around because it was nice out and he saw a few of his old female friends from school on Walsh Ave. He said that they were talking and flirting for about an hour in the street. He said that a male subject that he did not know approached them from the building across the street (44 Notre Dame Ave). NICHOLAS described the male subject as a white male, about 30-40 years old, average height and weight. He was not wearing a shirt and had work pants on.

NICHOLAS said that the male subject approached them and asked if he could ask the group a question. He said the male subject then started saying stuff to the girls about them ruining the neighborhood by staying up all night.

NICHOLAS said that he felt the male subject was harassing the females and that he was out of line. NICHOLAS said that he told the male subject to have some respect for the ladies. NICHOLAS said he was about 5 feet from the male subject and saw him pull out a silver/chrome revolver out of his left pocket with his left hand. He said that the male subject pointed the revolver at his face. NICHOLAS said he saw the male pull the hammer back on the revolver and he had his finger on the trigger. The male subject told him "you better watch who you're talking to!" He said that at that point he thought he might get shot. He said he put his hands into his pockets and slowly backed away from the male subject. NICHOLAS said he was in fear for his life.

As NICHOLAS backed away he said he heard the male subject say "Do you wanna die tonight?" and then saw the male subject point the revolver at E [REDACTED] NICHOLAS said that all of the kids scattered and he went to the second floor apartment at 76 Walsh Ave.

I went to speak to Sgt Gallant and informed him of the information I had received. He asked me to have NICHOLAS respond to MPD to fill out a written statement. I drove NICHOLAS to MPD and in the Juvenile Division in Interview Room C I had NICHOLAS fill out a written statement. I have entered the original statement into evidence as RJB1. I have copied the statement and included it in my report and have submitted it to the front counter. I then drove NICHOLAS back to 76 Walsh Ave.

I was informed that the male suspect had been identified as CHRISTOPHER JASKIEL (3/26/79) of 44 Notre Dame Ave Apt 2. He had been arrested and will be charged with two counts of Criminal Threatening (F).

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

On 8/1/2011 at approx. 04:24hrs. I OFC Ouellette was assigned to unit 1-3 on routine patrol. At this time I along with other units responded to the area of Cartier St and Walsh Ave. Dispatch informed us it was in reference to a male subject holding a gun. The wagon OFC C.P. Day and OFC Feather stated they witnessed two male subjects run into 44 Notre Dame Ave. I arrived and secured the rear perimeter located on the west side of the building of this address. Sgt Gallant and other units made contact at this address on the 2nd floor. When we were clear to break down the perimeter I took photos of the scene per Sgt Gallant. The photos taken were of three subjects from 44 Notre Dame Ave 2nd fl. I OFC Ouellette also took photos of 44 Notre Dame Ave which is on the corner of Notre Dame Ave and Walsh Ave as well as the surrounding area. I then took photos of a victim on the second floor of 76 Walsh Ave as well as a witness. There were two victims at this address that wished not to have there picture taken. All these subjects were ID and interviewed by officers on scene. I submitted these pictures into evidence. I cleared this call with a 102. NFI

On August 1, 2011 at approximately 0430 hours Officer Feather and I, Christopher P. Day #25 responded to the area of Walsh Street and Cartier Street in reference to a report of a subject with a weapon. While enroute, dispatch received reports that a white male with no shirt was the one that had a handgun. Upon arrival, I observed a white male with no shirt standing in the front of 44 Notre Dame (on northeast corner of Notre Dame and Walsh Street). As we came around the corner, this male subject observed the police wagon and immediately turned his back and ran directly in 44 Notre Dame Street. I also observed another male subject wearing a blue t-shirt run into 44 Notre Dame Street directly behind the subject as well. Officer Feather and I exited the wagon and ran after both of them. Both subjects were observed running into the doorway located on the Walsh Street entrance and run immediately up the staircase out of sight. Due to the nature of the call and an unknown subject with a weapon, Officer Feather and I stopped following them up the stairs and set up a perimeter. As officers arrived, the residence was surrounded and these two subjects remained inside.

Shortly after, I was advised that units made contact with the male subject in question in apartment #2 of 44 Notre Dame Street. I was also advised that a handgun was discovered and removed from his person without incident.

I was then briefed by several officers and requested by Sergeant Gallant to make contact with any other potential witnesses or victims in this incident. Information revealed that there may be another victim in this incident and that they may be located at 76 Walsh Street, Apt #3. Contact was made with several people in this apartment who explained that they had either witnessed this incident or was a victim as well. All parties were separated and officers began obtaining statements from everyone.

I first spoke with one,

JAMES LINDY



LINDY began by explaining that he was sitting outside 76 Walsh Street on the front steps when he observed a group of

females in the middle of the roadway (in front of 44 Notre Dame Street) talking loud. He then observed a white male subject, wearing no shirt, blue jeans, glasses, having blond hair and possibly in his 20's walk directly (from 44 Notre Dame Street) up to these females and tell them they are being too loud. As he was speaking with them, he observed "Nick" walk directly up to this male subject and tell him to leave these females alone. At this moment, LINDY told me that he observed the male subject with no shirt take out a silver handgun (holding in his right hand) and point it directly at "Nick" and state, "Don't look at me like that". LINDY further explained that he put the gun down and in the right side of his pocket until the police arrived. LINDY stated that the white male subject holding the gun at "Nick" was approximately 6 feet apart from one another and that the gun was pointed direct at his facial area. Once the police arrived on scene, he went directly inside the apartment and did not observe any other activity after this point.

LINDY did state that the male subject never pointed the gun at him at any point and that the only involvement he had was being witness to this event. We later requested to take a photograph of his person but he refused.

I then made contact with one,



Once I learned her age (15) we discovered her mother sleeping in the residence and requested her presence while I took her initial statement. Her mother was then identified as one,

NICOLE SHARPE



With her mother present, A [REDACTED] began by explaining that she observed a white male subject approach her in the middle of the roadway (in front of 44 Notre Dame Street) along with some of her friends. She further explained that this male subject confronted her and started yelling that this was his block and that they were too loud. As the subject was yelling directly at her, A [REDACTED] stated that her friend named "Nick" came from behind her and stood directly in front of her and told the male subject to leave them alone. At this time, A [REDACTED] told me that she observed this male subject pull out a silver handgun with his right hand and point it directly at "Nick's" head and state the following, "I will blow your fucken head off". After this statement was made, A [REDACTED] stated that "Nick" moved directly to his left and that the gun was now pointed directly at her head (she explained that she was positioned directly behind "Nick" at this time) for a second or two. She further explained that the male subject immediately put the gun down and directly into his right pocket area. She then retreated back and went into the apartment building until the police arrived.

A [REDACTED] did state that the male subject was holding the weapon in front of "Nick's" face within 3 feet and then in front of her face approximately 4 feet. I then requested A [REDACTED] to describe the male subject holding the gun and she stated he was a white male, in his early 30's, having long blond hair to the side, wearing a gray or white "wife beater" and blue jeans. A [REDACTED] did state that she was threatened for her life when this subject pointed the gun directly at her. I picture was taken of A [REDACTED] for evidence purposes.

The following is information on case # 11-11830

On 08/01/11 Officer C P. Day and I (Officer Feather) were I were working in the wagon on the midnight shift when we over heard a weapons call come over the radio. The location that was given was the corner of Cartier St and Walsh Ave. While en route units were advised that an older male with no shirt on had pulled a gun on his friend. The firearm was described as a small silver snub nose revolver.

As we pulled East on Walsh Ave the male with no shirt had started to run in the direction of the residence of 44 Notre Dame Ave. along with another male wearing a blue shirt. Both males ran on the porch that faces Walsh Ave through the side door and up the stairs. Officer Day and I followed the male through the door. When we arrived at the stairs that led to the second floor we stopped and waited for more units to assist. Other units arrived on scene and surrounded the residence. Contact was made on the second floor by other officers. The older male with no shirt fitting the description of the suspect was located on the second floor and brought to the sidewalk out front. a firearm was located in his right pants pocket. The firearm was cocked still but the cylinder was empty. The firearm is described as, a small silver Revolver which matches the description of the fire arm that was described in the call. Officers later located a box of Winchester 32 Auto ammunition. The box had two bullets out of the fifty that were unaccounted for. I later learned from his wife that this particular gun didn't fire the rounds that were in that box. This box of ammunition was obtained from another friend. Both the firearm and ammunition will be placed into evidence under DAF 1, 2.

While I was speaking to some potential witnesses I observed a small clear baggie with a moderate amount of green vegetative matter in the bag in plain view in the bushes in front of 76 Walsh Ave. I was unable to locate an owner to the said item so it will be place into safe keeping. That will be placed under DAF 3

MO: Criminal Threatening (Felony)

On 08/01/11 at approximately 0424 hours I responded to a report of an argument involving a firearm. While enroute Officer Feather in the transport wagon stated upon his arrival a suspect fled the area into the residence of 44 Notre Dame Ave. I arrived on scene and assisted in setting up a perimeter around the address by standing on the northeast corner of the building. Officer Feather advised that he saw the subject who fled the scene looking out the second floor window.

I pushed the double doors open on the east side of the building which led to a common stairwell. I cleared the common stairwell up through the 3rd floor. I remained on the 2nd floor landing and a male subject (Christopher JASKIEL 03/26/79) opened the 2nd floor apartment door. I gave verbal commands for the subject to lay on the ground. The subject followed the commands and was reacting very slow. Other Officer on scene secured Jaskiel and he was removed from the area. I along with Officer Tyler and Sgt. Gallant cleared the apartment and two more male subjects were located inside along with two babies.

Once the apartment was cleared I spoke with a subject inside who was identified as Estin VOGEL [REDACTED] While speaking with Vogel I was advised that a firearm was seized from Jaskiel as he had one in his pocket. I asked Vogel if he knew why the police were in his apartment and he stated no. Vogel said that his roommate Christopher was just outside and came in just a few moments prior to MPD's arrival. Vogel stated Christopher was arguing with the neighbors over a noise complaint. Vogel stated that when Christopher came in he stated he used a gun because people were not taking him seriously. Vogel denies actually seeing any of this incident. Vogel stated that Christopher has had possession of a handgun for the last few weeks. Vogel was cooperative and appeared to be honest regarding his knowledge of the incident.

While interviewing Vogel I was standing in Christophers bedroom where I observed several weapons which were in plain view. I observed a large knife with several cutting surfaces a machete, a box of Winchester .32 ammunition, and a hatchet at the bedside. I further observed a set of brass knuckles a throwing knife and a butterfly knife inside the apartment. 4 of the knives were seized for safe keeping given the incident and the fact that Christopher appeared intoxicated.

Additional Information

On 08/01/11 I (Officer Ellston) was assigned to Patrol Unit 1-4 on the Midnight Shift. At approximately 04:23 hours, multiple Officers responded to Cartier St. and Walsh Ave. for an incident involving a small revolver handgun. Dispatch further added that the offender, was a white male, wearing glasses, blue pants and was shirtless. The subject was later identified as Jaskiel, Christopher (03/The first responding Officers advised that they observed a subject fitting the aforementioned description run into 44 Notre Dame Ave. The Officers later broadcasted that they believed the subject entered the second floor apartment. I responded to the Notre Dame address to help secure the scene.

Sgt. Gallant, Officer Donahue and Officer Tyler then attempted to make contact with the occupants of the second floor apartment, as I secured the front entry way. The Officers were able to make contact and located Jaskiel. The Officers then requested that an additional Officer handcuff the subject for Officer safety. I went to the second floor hallway to assist the Officers.

I first observed Jaskiel in the hallway in front of the second floor apartment doorway. Jaskiel was lying on his stomach with his hands on his head. I then applied handcuffs to Jaskiel and informed him that he was not under arrest and was only being detained for Officer safety. I was then instructed to transport Jaskiel to the front stairs to the residence. As I was escorting Jaskiel down the stairs, he started to reach for his right pocket. Officer Feather was approaching from the opposite direction, observed Jaskiel's actions, grabbed his hands and located a small silver colored revolver from Jaskiel's right pants pocket. The weapon was clear and secured by Officer Feather.

I then spoke with Jaskiel on the front steps to the building. It should be noted that Jaskiel appeared to be heavily intoxicated. He had slurred speech, his eyes were bloodshot and he had an extreme sway when standing or walking. Jaskiel later admitted to consuming "six 16 oz. Natural Ice beers" during the course of the evening. Jaskiel first advised he was "hiding" the gun for an acquaintance named "Joshua Ornsteen." He claimed that Ornsteen "dropped" the gun in his apartment after having an issue with neighbors. Jaskiel further fabricated his story by claiming Ornsteen ran out the back door to his apartment prior to Police arrival.

Jaskiel later recanted his earlier statements and claimed he was responsible for the incident. He advised that he has had on going issues with neighbors in the area of Notre Dame and Walsh Ave. On the night of the incident he walked past the group, who were standing in front of 76 Walsh Ave. As Jaskiel walked by the group a subject, later visibly identified by Jaskiel started to yell profanities towards Jaskiel. The male was identified by Officers on scene as Sullivan, Nicholas [REDACTED] Sullivan informed Jaskiel that he was a "pussy." The incident upset Jaskiel, who then decided to go to his apartment and retrieve his "1886" revolver. He placed the unloaded revolver in his right pants

pocket and left his apartment. He then decided to return to the group and confront them.

The group started to exchange heated words as Jaskiel proceeded. He then stopped and removed the gun from his pocket. He then held the gun with his right hand and pointed it towards the ground. The gun was firmly placed against the front of Jaskiel's upper right thigh. After "one second" he then placed the gun back into his pocket. An unknown female in the group then started to complain to Jaskiel about his actions. Jaskiel then realized the severity of the incident and left the group. Jaskiel believed that Police were going to respond. As Jaskiel walked back to his apartment, he observed the first responding Officers. He then ran into his apartment to avoid contact. He added that he realized the error of his actions and knew he was probably going to be arrested. Jaskiel explained that he was the only source of income for his home and could not afford time away from work. Jaskiel was soon confronted by Officers at his apartment.






